- Dry Eucalypt Forest
Contains a number of vegetation complexes, such as the Blackbutt, Grey Gum-Grey Ironbark-Mahogany, Spotted Gum and Eastern Red Gum Complexes.
- Moist Eucalypt Forest
Contains the Moist Coastal and River Oak Complexes associated with the wetter areas and protected aspects.
- Estuarine Complex
Incorporates the Estuarine and Mangrove Complexes.
- Forestry Plantations
Includes native hardwood plantations of varying ages and sizes.
- Rainforest
Includes a variety of rainforest types, such as Corkwood-Sassafras-Crabapple and Yellow Carabeen.
- Swamp Forest
Includes complexes such as Swamp Forest, Paperbark and Swamp Oak.
- Coastal Vegetation
A wide variety of complexes associated with near coastal areas east of the Pacific Highway.
