Arterial / motorway standard

The initial design for this section of the highway is a combination of an arterial (called class A) and motorway (called class M) style highway.

This design allows for the highway to be upgraded to a full motorway style in the future when warranted by increased traffic volumes and funding for the project becomes available.

This speed limit would be posted at 100 km/h or 110 km/h, depending on final design access arrangements.

Highway access arrangements and interchanges

Highway access arrangements for this section of the highway include:

- Left-in left-out intersections.
- Right-in intersections across the median.
- U-turn facilities.
- Emergency crossover and U-turn facility.

These are shown on the map inside this community update A grade-separated interchange is proposed near

Arrawarra Beach Road. This interchange would be built Lemon Tree Road to Bald Knob Tick Gate Road. as part of the Sapphire to Woolgoolga Pacific Highway At this time no decision has been made in regard to upgrade project.

Service roads

Direct property access to the highway would be Some key benefits of the concept design include: rationalised. Service roads would provide access points to the highway for a number of properties at:

- McPhillips Road.
- Lemon Tree Road.
- Luthers Road.
- Eggins Drive.

Changes to the highway alignment

Changes to the highway alignment have occurred following consultation with stakeholders, property owners, and comments received since the display of the preferred route. These include:

- Alignment changes in the Luthers Road and Halfway Creek areas to minimise impact on residential properties.
- Alignment refined to minimise impact on Wells Crossing Flora Reserve.
- Upgrading of Eggins Drive to a through road connecting to Corindi Beach via Tasman Street.

Opportunities to stage construction


There are a number of opportunities to stage the construction of the upgrade. Stages could include:

- Arrawarra Beach Road to Range Road.
- Range Road to Dunmar Lane.

Completing the upgrade of the Pacific Highway

Currently 263 of a total 677 kilometres are now double-lane divided road. A further 91 kilometres are under construction or have had a construction contract awarded. The remaining kilometres are either approved for construction or have a preferred route identified.

The Pacific Highway is part of the AusLink National Network. By mid-2009 the New South Wales Government will have spent \$2.3 billion and the Australian Government \$1.3 billion towards the upgrade of the Pacific Highway.

Concept design

This community update describes the concept design for the Woolgoolga to Wells Crossing Pacific Highway upgrade.

The majority of the upgrade would be a duplication of the existing highway with a major realignment of the existing Pacific Highway proposed between Kangaroo Trail Road and Range Road to improve safety.

The project may continue to have refinements during the environmental assessment stage of the project and in response to community comments.

The concept design is on display for community comment until Friday 23 May 2008.


