

Welcome to the Pacific Highway Upgrade website for Woolgoolga to Wells Crossing.

The NSW Roads and Traffic Authority (RTA) has begun investigations into upgrading the Pacific Highway between Woolgoolga and Wells Crossing, as part of the Pacific Highway Upgrade Program.

The proposed 27.8km dual carriageway between Woolgoolga and Wells Crossing would significantly improve safety on this section of the Pacific Highway. Planning for the project is being funded by the NSW State Government as part of the \$2.2 billion Pacific Highway Upgrade Program.

This website provides information on the development process for the project, including opportunities for community and stakeholder involvement.

The October 2005 community update describes the route options that have been shortlisted for community consideration and the key issues associated with each of the options.


The Woolgoolga to Wells Crossing upgrade options will be on display until Friday 2 December 2005.



Field investigations

Field investigations, designed to identify constraints and opportunities, will be undertaken at various stages during the study period. Some of the key factors that need to be addressed are:

- What effect would a route option have on the environment?
- What are the potential benefits and costs in terms of economic, social, environmental, and functional issues associated with the route options?

The entire study area will be assessed initially, closely followed by more detailed field investigations focusing on the feasible route options. Once the preferred route has been selected, further field investigations and assessments will be undertaken. All the information collected during field studies will be used to accurately locate and maximise route alignment opportunities.

Investigations will consider:

- · Road safety.
- Traffic and transport.
- Topography, geology and soil investigations.
- Land use.
- Social.
- Noise, vibration and air.
- Plants and animals.
- Water.
- Economic.
- Visual and landscape.
- Indigenous and non-indigenous heritage.

The Woolgoolga to Wells Crossing upgrade will include community and stakeholder involvement that will ascertain the values, issues and concerns of the community.

Objectives

The key objectives of community involvement are to:

- Create stakeholder and community awareness of the study and the need for the upgrade.
- Understand stakeholder and community issues, values and concerns related to the project.
- Create stakeholder and community awareness of the route options and then the preferred route.
- Incorporate stakeholder and community issues into each phase of investigation, from the development of route options to the refinement of a preferred option and concept design.
- Assist stakeholders and the community to understand the results of the study and to understand the next steps.

The following activities will provide opportunities for the community to be informed and involved in the study:

- A project information line has been established so that members of the community can speak with a member of the project team during business hours. If the phone is unattended, please leave a message. Phone 1800 154 724 (free call).
- A community information session (CIS) was held on Monday 29 November 2004, at the Yarrawarra Community Lands Council, Large Conference Centre, 70 Red Rock Road, Corindi Beach, from 7-9pm.
- A community liaison group (CLG) has been formed to assist with the investigations. This group meets regularly with the study team.

- Community updates will be released at various stages of the project to provide information about project developments.
- Advertising in the local area will also keep the community informed throughout the project.

Community information session

A community information session was held on 29 November 2004 at the Yarrawarra Large Conference Centre, Corindi Beach. The evening was attended by approximately 30 community members and was designed to:

- Provide the community with an appreciation of the project and study process.
- Provide the community with an understanding of the scope of the studies to be undertaken.
- Listen to community concerns and suggestions.
- Start to define the issues that need to be considered by the study team.

Community liaison group

A community liaison group (CLG) has been formed to provide input into the investigations. This group will meet regularly to discuss route constraints and opportunities. This group is one of many ways in which the community can have input to the route development and assessment process.

Ecological focus group

An ecological focus group (EFG) has been established to advise the study team on current and emerging ecological issues.

The EFG will meet three times during the planning stage to help identify, communicate, represent and consider the ecological interests of the local community and other stakeholders potentially affected by the project.

Members of the EFG represent a variety of ecological and environmental organisations and agencies. Members are expected to communicate the information discussed at meetings with those they represent.


Route options
