





Temporary traffic changes to Broadwater Evans Head Road for the Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway upgrade

The Australian and NSW governments are jointly funding the Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway upgrade. Roads and Maritime Services' Pacific Highway Project Office, Pacific Complete and its contractor partners are working together to deliver the upgrade.

As part of the upgrade, an interchange is being built at Broadwater Evans Head Road, Broadwater. The interchange will include two roundabouts that will provide vehicle access to and from the Pacific Highway (north) as well as a bridge across the Pacific Highway.

Main construction will start in August, weather permitting and will continue for about 18 months.




The first stage of our work involves temporarily realigning Broadwater Evans Head Road about 40 metres to the south of the existing road. We have provided a map to show the location of the temporary road.

The next stage will involve earthwork and bridge building including:

- Carrying out earthwork and pavement work for the bridge and the connections to the ramps and the existing road
- Driving piles into the ground using a combination of cranes, piling rigs and vibrating hammers

- Pouring concrete for the piles
- Finishing the pile caps including jack hammering
- Building piers (upright supports for the bridge) and headstocks (that sit on top of the piers)
- Delivering and installing bridge girders
- Installing precast girders and pouring concrete bridge deck
- Finishing work, including signage, line marking and landscaping.



How will this work affect you?

Road users are asked to drive to the changed traffic conditions in the area, observe signs and follow the direction of traffic controllers.

Hauling material across Broadwater Evans Head Road will continue. Temporary traffic delays of up to two minutes in both directions will occur when trucks and machinery need to cross Broadwater Evans Head Road.

Our work will be noisy at times and may cause some disturbance. Piling, in particular, driven piling, can create increased noise and vibration levels as a result of hammering activity. It is likely you will be able to hear these activities if they are near your property. We will carry out noise monitoring throughout this work. We will also carry out noise mitigation to minimise the impact of our work.

Work hours

Typically, work will be carried out during the project's approved construction hours, which are:



No work will be carried out on Sundays or public holidays.

Nearby residents will be notified at least five working days in advance of any activities scheduled outside of these working hours.

Traffic management

There will be some temporary traffic changes while this work is carried out. Reduced speed limits and lane closures may be in place and may affect travel times.
