
Temporary traffic change on Broadwater Evans Head Road, Broadwater

Roads and Maritime Services, Pacific Complete and its contractor partners are working together to deliver the Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway upgrade.

The project team is finishing work on a temporary realignment of Broadwater Evans Head Road where it intersects with the upgrade. Traffic will be temporarily moved from 24 November, weather permitting.

We have included a map to show the location of this traffic change.

This new traffic arrangement is temporary for up to 12 months and will allow the interchange at Broadwater Evans Head Road to be built.



The next stages will involve earthwork and building the new Broadwater Evans Head Road overpass bridge. This work will continue for about 12 months and will include:

- Carrying out earthwork and paving the bridge and the approaches
- Driving piles into the ground using a combination of cranes, piling rigs and vibrating hammers
- Pouring concrete for the piles
- Finishing the pile caps including jack hammering
- Building piers (upright supports for the bridge) and headstocks (that sit on top of the piers)
- Delivering and installing bridge girders
- Installing precast girders and pouring concrete bridge deck
- Finishing work, including signage, line marking and landscaping.

How will this work affect you?

Road users are asked to drive to the changed traffic conditions in the area, observe signs and follow the direction of traffic controllers.

Hauling of material along the alignment and across Broadwater Evans Head Road will continue. Temporary traffic delays of up to two minutes in both directions will occur when trucks and machinery need to cross Broadwater Evans Head Road.

How we manage our work

The project team will use machinery that generates noise, light and vibration. To manage this work, we will:

- Turn-off machinery when not in use
- Direct temporary lighting down and away from homes
- Plan activities close to residents to coincide with normal construction hours, where possible
- Fit equipment with devices to minimise noise, particularly reversing squawkers
- Monitor noise so we can manage any potential impacts and adjust our work as required.

All work will be carried out in line with the project's Conditions of Approval and Construction Environmental Management Plan.

Work hours

Typically work will be carried out during the project's approved construction hours, which are:



In areas where residents live more than 200 metres from the work, extended approved work hours are allowed between 6am and 7am and 6pm and 7pm from Monday to Friday. No work will be carried on Sunday or a public holiday.

Traffic changes

To manage queuing and safety, there will be some temporary traffic changes that may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.
