Changed traffic conditions on Avenue Road and Wants Lane, Glenugie and Wooli Road, Pillar Valley for the Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway upgrade.

The Australian and NSW governments are jointly funding the Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway upgrade. Roads and Maritime Services' Pacific Highway Project Office, Pacific Complete and its contractor partners are working together to deliver the upgrade.

In preparation for the upcoming opening of the Wooli Road and Avenue Road overpass bridges, there will be changed traffic conditions between Old Six Mile Lane south, Old Six Mile Lane north and Wants Lane, Glenugie from Monday 30 July 2018, weather permitting.

Both overpasses will be two lanes and provide local access for the community while we continue to build the upgrade. We have provided maps to show the location of the work and changed traffic conditions.

What work are we doing?

Work the project team will be doing to complete the Avenue Road overpass includes installing barriers, earthwork, drainage, asphalting, line marking and the installing parapets along the bridge.

Two new intersections for Wants Lane and Old Six Mile North will also be built. To do this, the project team will temporarily close Wants Lane (west). Residents and local road users will need to access Wants Lane from Eight Mile Road near Sandy Creek.

Work the project team will be doing to complete the Wooli Road overpass includes earthwork, drainage and building the road surface.


There will be temporary traffic changes including changes to speed limits to ensure the safety of road users while work is carried out. Single lane alternate traffic flow under traffic control will be in place on Avenue Road and Wooli Road during construction times. The speed limit will be reduced to 40km/hr and temporary traffic lights will operate outside of normal working hours. This may affect travel times.


How will the work affect you?

The potential impacts could include:

- Short traffic delays for road users
- Construction noise
- Dust.

Our work may be noisy at times from trucks and other heavy machinery. We will carry out dust and noise monitoring throughout this work to minimise the impact where possible.





Work hours

Typically work will be carried out during the project's approved construction hours, which are:



In areas where residents lie more than 200 metres from the project boundary, extended work hours of 6am to 7pm from Monday to Friday, are allowed and work is carried out during these times.

Out of hours

The project team needs to do work outside of normal construction hours to ensure the safety of construction workers and motorists. Traffic control will be in place on Avenue Road, Glenugie from 5.30am to 6.30pm between Monday and Friday and from 6am on Saturday while we carry out this work.
