Temporary traffic change at Coolgardie Road, Pimlico on Tuesday 14 November 2017

The Australian and NSW governments are jointly funding the \$4.36 billion Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway upgrade. Roads and Maritime Services Pacific Highway Project Office and Pacific Complete are working together to deliver the project.

As part of the Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway upgrade a new Coolgardie Road interchange is being built to provide safe access to the new highway for road users.

To start this work, the Woolgoolga to Ballina project team will be installing environmental controls and a fauna grid to the eastern end of Coolgardie Road.

The project team will excavate a small section of the road surface and then place gravel material in the excavated area and install the permanent fauna grid, weather permitting. For the safety of road users and workers, the project team needs to temporarily close Coolgardie Road, while this work carried out.

Temporary road closure

Between 7am and 6pm on Tuesday 14 November, weather permitting, road users will be asked to seek an alternate route via Whytes Lane, Pimlico or Sinclair Street, Wardell to access Pimlico Road, Pimlico.

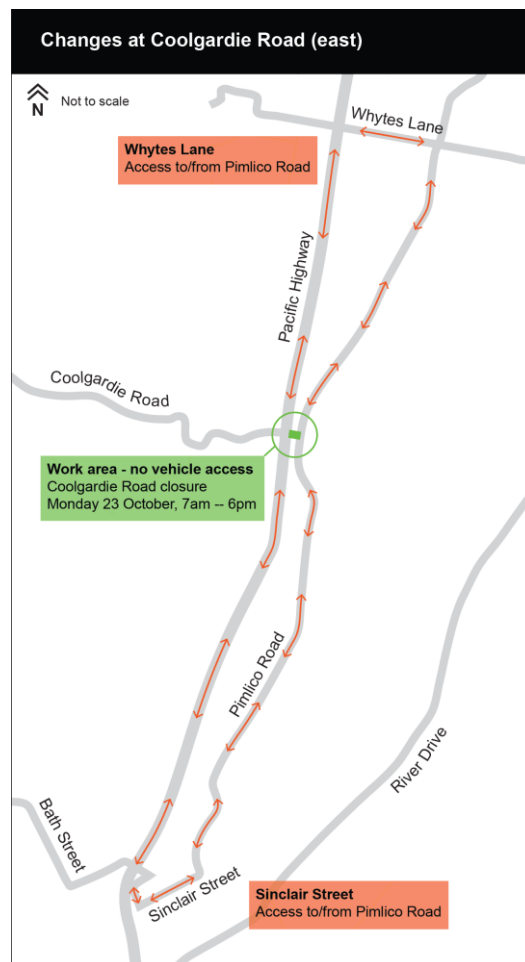
Resident access to properties on the eastern end of Coolgardie Road will be managed with traffic control. We have provided a map to show the location of the work area and alternative travel routes. Motorists are asked to drive carefully, keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signage. All work will be carried out in line with the project's Conditions of Approval and Construction Environment Management Plan.

How will work affect you?

During work, nearby residents and road users can expect:

- Short-term traffic detours
 - Minor delays for residents accessing properties located on the eastern end of Coolgardie Road
 - Changes along the road including traffic barriers, bollards and flagging around the work area
 - Increased noise levels due to the use of heavy machinery and equipment
 - Some dust due to the nature of the work
 - Low levels of vibration during the use of construction equipment and machinery
 - Flashing lights and reversing alarms from machinery and vehicles for the safety of workers.
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Work hours

Typically work will be carried out during the project's approved construction hours, which are:



7am – 6pm Monday – Friday
8am – 5pm Saturdays

In areas where residents live more than 200 metres from the work area, extended work hours are allowed between 6am and 7am and 6pm and 7pm from Monday to Friday. Nearby residents will be notified at least five working days in advance of any activities scheduled outside of these working hours.
