Temporary traffic change on the Pacific Highway, Pimlico for Woolgoolga to Ballina upgrade

The Australian and NSW governments are jointly funding the Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway upgrade. Roads and Maritime Services, Pacific Complete and its contractor partners are working together to deliver the upgrade.

The project team has almost finished building the new diversion road between Coolgardie Road, Coolgardie and Whytes Lane, Pimlico. Pacific Highway traffic will be temporarily moved into these lanes from Friday 19 October, weather permitting.

We have included a map to show the location of this traffic change.

This new traffic arrangement is temporary and will allow the project team to maintain capacity on the road network while safely continuing to build new Pacific Highway northbound and southbound lanes. Some of the new diversion road is permanent.

How we manage our work

The project team will use machinery that generates noise, light and vibration. To manage this work we will:

- Direct temporary lighting down and away from homes
- Locate equipment such as generators as far as possible from residences
- Turn off machinery when not in use
- Plan activities to minimise noise from reversing vehicles
- Monitor noise and implement further mitigation measures, if required.

All work will be carried out in line with the project's Conditions of Approval and Construction Environmental Management Plan.

Approved construction hours Monday to Friday 7am–6pm Saturday 8am–5pm

In areas where residents live more than 200 metres from the work, extended hours are allowed between 6am and 7am and 6pm and 7pm from Monday to Friday. No work will be carried on Sunday or a public holiday.

Work outside of normal construction hours

To complete the temporary traffic change, work is required outside normal construction hours for technical reasons. This work is planned between 6pm and 7am for four nights from Monday 15 October, weather permitting.


Building next to, over and on existing roads may require traffic to be stopped or reduced to one lane while work is carried out. By working at night, delays are minimised and journey times for motorists are less affected.

For work that measures below five decibels at residential properties or if it is needed for technical reasons, the project team is only required to notify the community.

Traffic changes

To manage traffic queuing and safety, there will be a lane closure that may affect travel times. Please obey speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.
