Start of work - Piling South of Old Six Mile Lane

The Australian and NSW governments are jointly funding the \$4.36 billion Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway upgrade. Roads and Maritime Services Pacific Highway Project Office and Pacific Complete are working together to deliver the project.

In line with start of work notification issued on the 3rd of October 2017 and attached to this email, the project's piling contractor Advanced Foundation Solutions will start work within the project boundary south of Old Six Mile Lane.

The project team will start bored piling works for this bridge from Monday 23rd of October for approximately one month, weather permitting.

Work to be carried out

Piling work will involve:


- Moving cranes and other heavy plant into the work area from Avenue Road
- Light vehicles accessing the site from Avenue Road and Old Six Mile Lane
- Welding and boring pile tubes, placement of steel and filing with concrete
- Trimming the tops of concrete piles.

Work hours

Typically work will be carried out during the project's approved construction hours, which are:



In areas where residents live more than 200 metres from the work area, extended work hours are allowed between 6am and 7am and 6pm and 7pm from Monday to Friday. Nearby residents will be notified at least five working days in advance of any activities scheduled outside of these working hours.
