#### Introduction

#### **Project description**

The Coffs Harbour Bypass (CHB) is a 14 km bypass of Coffs Harbour from south of England's Road to Korora Hill in the north. The project was declared Critical State Significant Infrastructure under the NSW Environmental Planning & Assessment Act 1979 (EP&A Act) as it is considered to be essential for the State for economic, environmental or social reasons. It is funded by the Australian and NSW governments.

The project was approved by NSW Government (SSI-7666) on 2 November 2020, with Federal approval (EPBC 2017/8005) granted on 8 December 2020. The major construction contract was awarded to the Joint Venture between Ferrovial and Gamuda in June 2022. The project's Construction Environmental Management Plan was approved enabling major construction to commence on 31 March 2023 and is expected to take between four and five years to complete.

The location and key features of the CHB include (refer Figure 1.1):

- Four-lane divided highway from south of England's Road roundabout to the dual carriageway highway at Sapphire Beach
- Bypass of the Coffs Harbour urban area from south of England's Road intersection to Korora Hill
- Upgrade of the existing Pacific Highway between Korora Hill and the dual carriageway highway at Sapphire Beach
- Grade separated interchanges at England's Road, Coramba Hill and Korora Hill
- A one-way local access road along the western side of the project between the southern tie-in and England's Road, connecting properties to the road network via England's Road
- A new service road, located east of the project, connecting Solitary Islands Way with James Small Drive and the existing Pacific Highway near Bruxner Park Road
- Three short tunnels through ridges at Roberts Hill (around 190 metres long), Shepards Lane (around 360 metres long) and Gatelys Road (around 450 metres long)
- Relocation of the Kororo Public School bus interchange and Luke Bowen footbridge

#### Purpose of this report

The purpose of this document is to facilitate demonstration by Transport for NSW of satisfactory compliance with the Commonwealth approval conditions for the Coffs Harbour Bypass Pacific Highway Upgrade project with particular reference to Condition 7. The report covers the reporting period from 27 August 2022 to 27 August 2023.

For each condition, one or more actions are identified which, once implemented, will achieve satisfactory compliance with the condition. Where appropriate, the timing for completion of individual actions is identified.

For each action, the minimum relevant documentation to support demonstration of compliance is identified. This documentation would inform any future compliance audit.

The status of each of the compliance requirements and the timeframes for action have generally been addressed in accordance with the following definitions, unless specific dates are requested.

#### Work undertaken during the reporting period

During the reporting period the Coffs Harbour Bypass has continued early works to further develop the detailed design which has included:

- Geotechnical investigations
- Utility relocation works (power, water and telecommunications).
- Archaeological and cultural salvage activities
- Translocation of Rusty Plum, Slender Marsdenia, Fontaine Coffs Harbour sp. and Pittosporum Coffs Harbour sp in accordance with management plans submitted to the Department of Planning and Environment.
- At-house noise treatments for properties identified as being eligible for treatment in the Coffs Harbour Bypass Amendment Report (June 2020)
- Surface water and groundwater monitoring data collection
- Site contamination investigation and associated remediation works.
- · Establishment of main site compound

Major construction commenced on 31 March 2023 which has also involved:

- Installing sediment basins and erosion controls
- Installing Panama disease management control measures
- Vegetation removal
- Earthwork activities including controlled blasting.

E12 (Koala offset credits sourced from the same IBRA subregion) - Koala species credits from the Coffs Coast and Escarpment IBRA subregion have been identified and included in the Biodiversity Offset Package.

E13 (koala habitat restoration) – Planning for the proposed koala habitat restoration is underway. TfNSW received approval from DPE for the proposed mechanism for protection of Restored Koala Habitat being Biodiversity Stewardship Agreements on 7 December 2022.

E15 and E16 (Threatened Species Management Plan (TSMP)) – The TSMP for the early works program affecting threatened species habitat has been submitted to DPE for information on 24 March 2021 and was

				prepared in consultation with EESG, DAWE, DPI Fisheries and Coffs Harbour City Council. DPE responded on the 24 June 2021 acknowledging TfNSW response to DPE comments.  The draft TSMP for mainline construction was submitted to agencies including Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water for review on 25 January 22, prior to resubmission to DPE on 16 March 2022. DPE responded on 6 April 2022. The TSMP is currently being updated to reflect proposed minor changes to connectivity structures.

The Black Booyong - Rosewood - Yellow Carabeen subtropical rainforest of the NSW North Coast Bioregion has the same benchmark values, the same value for CMA percent cleared and represents the same vegetation formation (Rainforest) and class (Subtropical Rainforest) as NR280. As such, the offsetting calculations will result in the same requirement and offsetting options. The clearing footprint has resulted in net saving of NR280 of 1.27ha and the clearing 0.60ha of Black Booyong - Rosewood - Yellow Carabeen subtropical rainforest of the NSW North Coast Bioregion is accommodated within the approved clearing area limits.
