Out of Hours Work on the Coffs Harbour bypass project – northern utilities

Notification of upcoming out of hours work on James Small Drive

Quickway has been engaged to continue low impact work on the Coffs Harbour bypass project. As part of the utility relocations, works to connect newly installed watermain services will occur near Kororo Public School on James Small Drive at Korora.

Work will need to occur outside standard construction hours to minimise disruption to school traffic and water supply to the school during school and after school care hours.

Work will occur between **8am and 6pm** on **Saturday 6 May** and, if required, between **8am and 6pm** on **Sunday 7 May 2023**, weather permitting.

Prior to 1pm on Saturday, work will involve excavation of existing service lines, saw cutting and removing the existing pipes. After 1pm on Saturday and on Sunday (if required), the newly installed watermain will be connected. Machinery will include excavators, a vacuum truck, heavy and light vehicles, tipper trucks and a concrete saw.

Traffic control will be in place where required on James Small Drive. Driveway access will be maintained at all times, however pedestrians and cyclists may experience a change in footpath conditions. If required, traffic control will be in place to escort footpath users to ensure their safety.

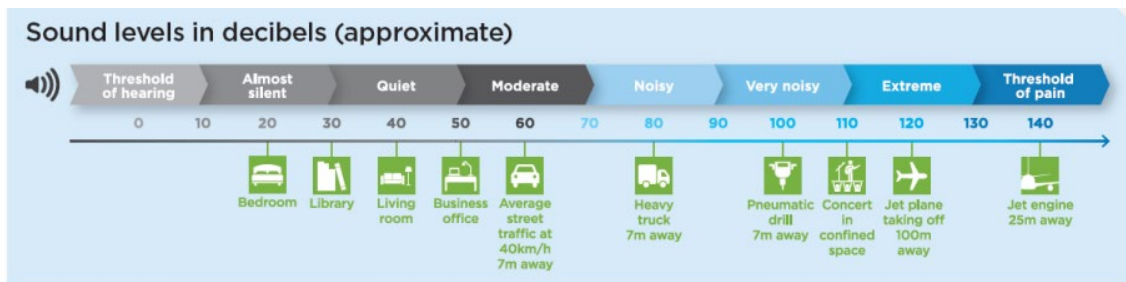
How could this work impact you?

All efforts will be made to minimise disruption to the surrounding community and environment while this connection work is being carried out. We are committed to mitigating construction impacts on the surrounding residents by:

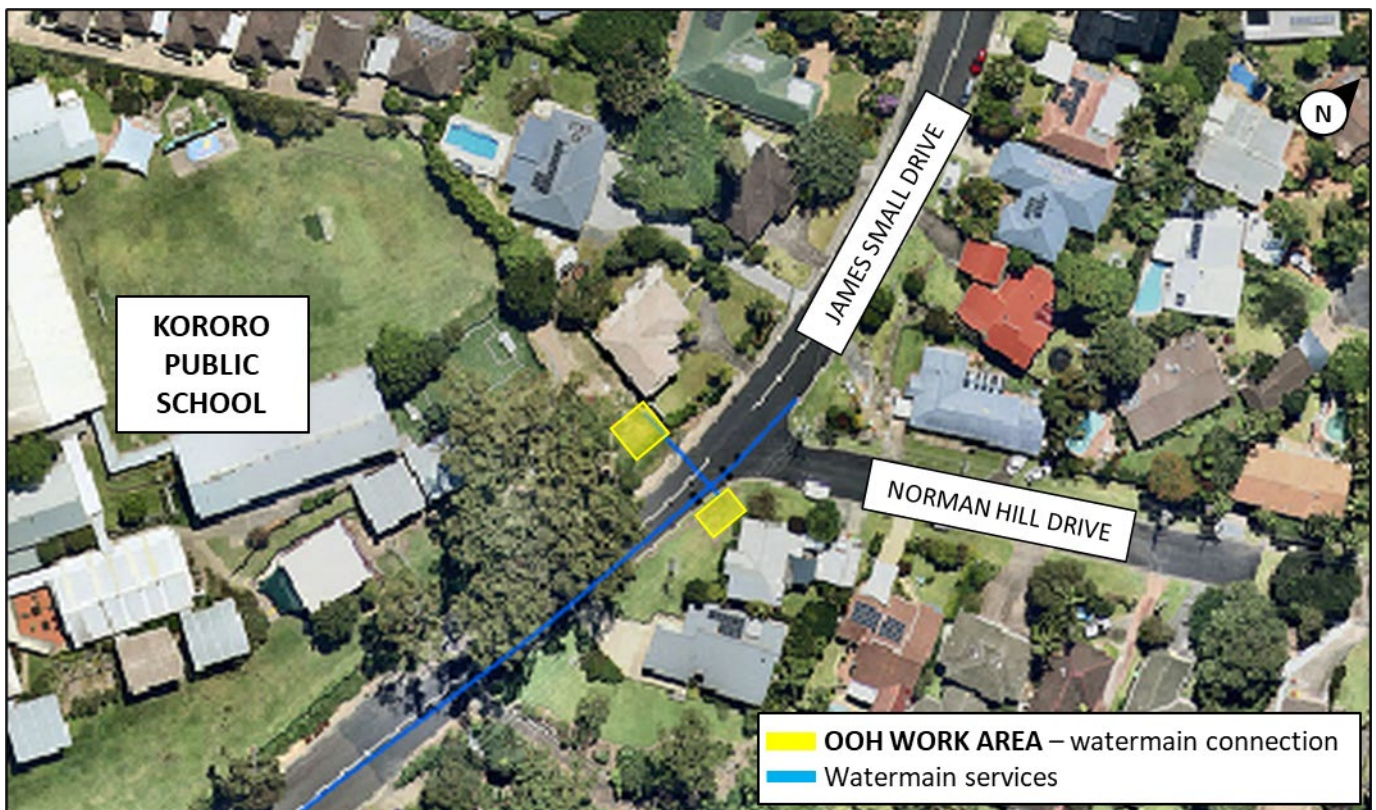
- consulting with directly impacted residents ahead of the work starting and during works
- work involving machinery will occur in stages to minimise noise levels
- turning off vehicles when not in use
- using non-tonal reversing beepers and instructing workers to keep noise to a minimum
- verification monitoring of generated noise levels
- orientating machinery with the noisiest elements directed away from receivers and noise blankets installed wherever possible.

Some residents may experience restrictions to their water supply during this work. Should your property be affected you will be contacted by your utility provider.

The predicted noise levels are expected to be at the moderate to noisy level for residents closest to the works, and can be viewed in the illustration below:

Looking ahead

Over the next three months, additional work is anticipated for as follows:

- Semi trailer deliveries out of hours into working areas at Pacific Bay Resort, Charlesworth Bay Road, Bruxner Park Road and James Small Drive, periodically until May 2023.
- Barrier removal on the Pacific Highway near Banana Coast Caravan Park and Old Coast Road.
- Additional underboring and trenching activities next to the Pacific Highway and local roads, including Old Coast Road, James Small Drive, Bruxner Park Road, and Charlesworth Bay Road, periodically until June 2023.
- Removal of vegetation and banana trees from Gatelys Road northern tunnel portal to the Pacific Highway and north to Bruxner Park Road between 17 April and 30 June 2023. This work will be carried out during standard construction hours. The project team will follow approved requirements when handling banana plant waste to minimise the risk of spreading Panama disease which can seriously impact plantations.

- Out of hours geotechnical investigations on the Pacific Highway just north of Banana Coast Caravan Park from approximately 7pm until midnight on May 1 and, if required, May 2, 2023, weather permitting. While works are in progress one lane travelling north will be closed.
- The project team will be building access roads and minor site compounds in the northern section of the project and some out of hours work may be required.

Unexpected circumstances may initiate the need for additional out of hours work to occur outside of the above timeframes. In all events, Transport for NSW will provide written notification before the work commences. In addition, directly impacted residents will be contacted and advised of the likely impact and what we are doing to minimise disruption during the work.
