Nightwork on the Pacific Highway, Korora for the Coffs Harbour bypass

The Australian and NSW governments are funding the \$2.2 billion, 14-kilometre Coffs Harbour bypass project. The bypass will boost the regional economy and improve connectivity, road transport efficiency and safety for local and interstate motorists.

As part of major construction, the Coffs Harbour bypass project is installing concrete barriers from Old Coast Road to north of Campbell Close.

To minimise impact to traffic and ensure the safety of motorists, community and our workers, the work on the Pacific Highway northbound carriageways be carried out for **four nights** from **Monday 7 August 2023.** During this period there will be no more than two consecutive nights of work. If weather interrupts this work, it will be completed the following week.

How will the work affect you?

There will be a single lane closure on the the Pacific Highway northbound carriageway between Old Coast Road and Campbell Close. Access to local roads and private properties will be maintained.

Installing barriers requires an excavator, semi-trailers with cranes, light vehicles, light towers and traffic control. To minimise noise impacts, we will switch off vehicles and equipment when not in use.

This work is progressive in nature, meaning the noise and work impacts will be short in any one area. The predicted noise levels for this night work is expected to be moderate to noisy. The figure below explains these noise levels.



During this night work, there will be speed reductions, lane closures and traffic control on the highway to ensure the safety of workers and motorists. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs. 
Safety


Coffs Harbour bypass is continuing major construction with active working sites across the alignment. We have started, and will continue, to be using large plant and equipment across our sites as well as carrying out controlled blasting, hammering and drilling. For the safety of the community and our workers, access to the bypass construction site is restricted to authorised personnel only. Members of the public should not enter any Coffs Harbour bypass construction site at any time.

Looking Ahead

Upcoming bypass work in this area includes:

 Out of hours watermain work will be carried out at the corner of Norman Hill Drive and James Small Drive, Korora between 31 July and 5 August 2023, weather permitting. This work involves a





- Continuing to build the road extension of Russ Hammond Close into Korora School Road until **September 2023**.
- Continuing trenching and under-boring on the western side of the Pacific Highway between Old Coast Road and Bruxner Park Road will until **September 2023.**
- Removing overhead power lines and poles along the Pacific Highway between Bruxner Park Road and Campbell Close with a single northbound highway lane closure outside of standard construction hours over three consecutive weekends from Saturday 5 August to Sunday 20 August 2023.
- Relocating the intersection of the Pacific Highway and Campbell Close about 500m north of its current position in **mid late 2023**. This work will include some out of hours construction.
