


Concrete barrier relocation on the Pacific Highway, Korora

Coffs Harbour bypass

July 2024







Transport for NSW acknowledges the Gumbaynggirr people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

The Australian and NSW Governments are funding the 14-kilometre Coffs Harbour bypass project. The bypass will boost the regional economy and improve connectivity, road transport efficiency and safety for all motorists.

What work are we doing?

For major construction, the Coffs Harbour bypass is:

- carrying out boring for temporary drainage under the Pacific Highway near the corner of Opal Boulevard, Korora
- relocating and maintaining concrete barriers along the Pacific Highway between Bruxner Park Road and Campbell Close, Korora.

When and where we'll be working

We will carry out the drainage work on **Tuesday 9 and Wednesday 10 July 2024** and the relocating of concrete barriers between **Monday 15** and **Friday 19 July 2024** from **7pm to 6am.** If rain interrupts this work, it will be completed the following week.

What will this mean for you?

All night work will involve light vehicles, lighting towers, traffic control and a street sweeper. A crane will be used to relocate concrete barriers and under-boring will use a vacuum truck, drill rig and a small excavator.

The predicted noise level for this work is quiet to noisy. We have included a comparison of noise levels to help explain this noise level.

During this work, there will be speed reductions, lane closures and traffic control on the highway and Opal Boulevard to ensure the safety of workers and motorists. Please keep to the speed limit and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs. Managing our impacts


To minimise noise impacts, we will switch off vehicles and equipment when not in use and work closer to residential properties and undertake noisier work earlier in the night, where possible.

Remember to ACT

Always remember to ACT when driving near the bypass.

- Be **Aware**: Keep up to date with project information and the latest traffic changes.
- Be **Cautious**: Follow signage, drive to the conditions, and follow the direction of traffic control.
- Allow more **Time**: Plan for minor delays and be patient on the road.



Current and upcoming construction

Other construction work in this area includes:

 Removing the median and building pavement and drainage along the Pacific Highway between Charlesworth Bay Road and Sapphire Beach Interchange including some out of hours work

- Building bridges with in-situ concrete pours and delivering and placing precast elements including some out of hours work
- Carrying out bulk earthworks and installing culverts and drains
- Carrying out periodic out of hours street sweeping and vegetation maintenance
- Carrying out survey, geotechnical and pavement investigations
- Using internal haulage routes and maintaining these routes and environmental controls including some out of hours work
- Delivering machinery and materials on approved routes and within the project boundary including some out of hours work
- Maintaining and refuelling plant and machinery including some out of hours work
- Changing local road, pedestrian, and cyclist access to the Pacific Highway between Bruxner Park Road and Sapphire Beach Interchange including some out of hours work.
